
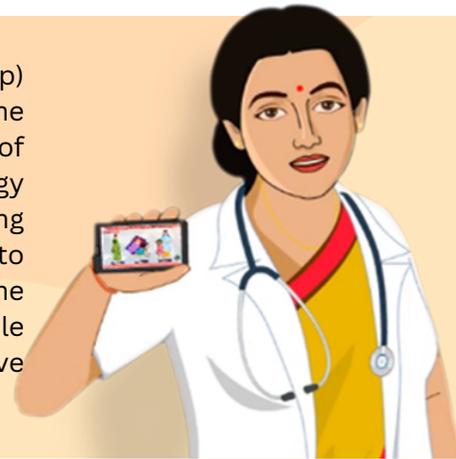


RAPID IMMUNIZATION SKILL ENHANCEMENT

RISE is an innovative, learner-centric, e-learning platform (mobile/web app) designed to build the capacity of healthcare workers involved in routine immunization in India. Conceptualised and developed by JSI under the guidance of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), it leverages digital technology to complement traditional classroom training by offering a self-paced learning experience, thus revolutionizing how healthcare workers are trained. Designed to enhance knowledge and skills, it also keeps the health care workers updated on the evolving Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) guidelines. With its scalable design and user-friendly interface, the aim is to ultimately improve immunization outcomes across the country.

RISE MODULES

The RISE platform consists of 5 specialized modules, each developed based on the insights from a comprehensive Capacity Building Needs Assessment. This assessment meticulously analyzed the training needs of vaccinators at the field level, ensuring the content is tailored to meet their specific challenges and requirements of vaccinators.

Each module includes a pre-test and post-test, where learners must achieve a minimum score of 70% to generate a certificate for that module. Upon completing all five modules, the learner will be awarded a Master Certificate.

PROGRESS AT A GLANCE

Among the **1,50,544** learners in 324 Go LIVE districts on the platform, **98%** of learners have **started the first module**, and **94%** have **completed all modules**. Figure A illustrates the module-wise percentage progress of learners.


Overall knowledge gain is calculated based on the difference between the pre and post-test scores of learners who have completed all five modules.

The maximum knowledge gain is observed in the second module, focused on injection safety and vaccine administration, with more than 50% of learners achieving a score improvement of more than 20 percentage points.


Learners can earn two types of certificates based on their performance:




Module Wise Progress Status (till January 2026)




Pre and Post Test Scores of Learners (%)

Key Activities across RISE Intervention States

ARUNACHAL PRADESH



100% module 5 completion rate was achieved by Lohit and Tawang district.

Field visits to directly engage with learners and reorient on the RISE module was conducted in Itanagar Capital region, Papum Pare & Anjaw districts.

The Health Worker Modules 5 has a 96.5% completion rate.

Meghalaya



The Meghalaya State Launch & Training Workshop was successfully held on 20th January 2026, graced by esteemed dignitaries, including Director of Health Services—MCH & FW and Joint Mission Director, NHM and Joint Director of Health Services and State Immunization Officer, Government of Meghalaya for all 12 districts across the State.

Participation from District Immunization Officers (DIO), Medical Health Officers and District Data Managers from all 12 intervention districts along with key immunization partners such as WHO, UNICEF and UNDP.

Cascade trainings planned in February 2026.

Key Activities across RISE Intervention States

UTTAR PRADESH



RI Supervisors as learners were motivated to complete all RISE modules and were reoriented on the app's features, with hands-on support during field visits across 21 districts and 35 blocks.

District initiated identifying and enrolling newly recruited and contractual vaccinators as per SEPIO's recommendations

Module 5 completion rate of vaccinator is 99.3% and RI Supervisors, Module 1 initiation rate is 90% and completion rate stands at 69%.

RAJASTHAN



The team provided hands-on support on RISE modules to the learners across 18 districts across the state during field visit.

Support was provided to overcome technical hurdles, including login issues and navigation issues, along with providing support to complete pending modules.

The team also facilitated new learner registrations and conducted rapid assessments to gauge progress.

The overall module completion rate is at 97%.



“There were many families in our area who used to hesitate in getting their children vaccinated because due to the myths, rumors and lack of awareness prevalent in the society, they hesitate to come for vaccination in the rural environment due to which it has been challenging to achieve the vaccination targets. This year, we were introduced to RISE application, through which we got many important information related to vaccination. We got detailed information about how to overcome vaccination hesitancy. After reading this module, we got the understanding of how to motivate families who refuse to get vaccinated. Through this module, we got information about effective communication strategies to build trust in the community and overcome vaccination hesitancy, how to directly communicate with anti-vaccination families, form small groups and do home visits, listen to the concerns of parents and provide them with correct information about vaccination, how can we dispel doubts and myths by working with local leaders, teachers and health group workers to give a positive message about vaccination. We are gradually getting success in reducing the hesitancy of people towards vaccination in our area.”

“I have got many doubts related to vaccination cleared through RISE App, like it was forbidden to use cotton swab during vaccination, but RISE modules have provided us with correct information such as, to use dry and clean cotton swab. Detailed information has been provided about maintenance of cold chain and vaccine management, identification of AEFI, proper use & disposal of syringes and vaccine hesitancy.

For Vaccine Avoidance Behaviour (VAB) mobilization, I personally talk to each beneficiary and go to their homes to motivate them, now there is no VAB in my area.

Till now I have managed 16 minor AEFIs. So far I have motivated about 20 parents who had initially avoided vaccination due to fear of AEFIs and possible reactions- to get their child vaccinated. I write my phone number in the MCP Card of each beneficiary, and whenever they have any query related to vaccination, they call me and tell me their problem, which I solve”.
